Stellars share a **common attitude**, encapsulated in the epilogue of *The Way to Happiness*: "There is no person alive who cannot make a new beginning."

They share a **common interest** in the Criminon program: restoration of self-respect, study and parenting skills, drug education, personal integrity and dealing with suppression.

They share **common goals**: helping others start on their journey of self-betterment, so they too may experience positive change in their lives.

When a Stellar student hands a Criminon referral card to another, his message is, "Your survival is important to me." When he not only refers others, but builds teams of students who do the same, thereby creating a Criminon Community, he is truly taking responsibility for his fellow man. He knows it is in his power to "point the way to a less dangerous and happier life," and he acts upon that knowledge.

Luc C., who united like-minded Criminon students in this way, points out that: "A Criminon Community keeps everyone positive, focused and on track to a successful future" (see 'Words from the Wise', page 3).

Criminon Communities are a powerful force, radiating positivity, mutual respect and understanding which ripples out through the environment. As a result conflicts lessen and tensions ease. And that is undisputedly good for staff and prisoners alike.

The friendship was centered around learning for both - Cleveland taught Gabriele how to read and write Braille so he could help him with his studies. When Gabriele became a Stellar Student, Cleveland decided he wanted to sign up with Criminon. Gabriele would read the lessons to Cleveland and write down the answers he gave. This partnership continued until a transfer separated them.

One day I got a letter from Gabriele asking me if the Cleveland W. announced as a new Stellar in the newsletter was the same person he helped with Criminon courses. I told him yes it was, and that's when he told me the whole story of their friendship. He said, "Cleveland has again done something to make me so proud of him. He has shown that any handicap can be overcome." Cleveland's response was, "I can never repay him for what he has done for me. I will always love him as my big brother."

WORDS FROM THE WISE



THE WAY TO HAPPINESS HOW TO PLAY

he name of the game is getting new students onto and using the precepts of The Way to Happiness distance learning course. It's a win-win situation. You win, the students you enroll win, and others in your institution win too. YOU can make a difference in someone else's life!

- Signing up students is the first step. Choose people you
 think are ready for a change. Tell them about how much your
 life has changed since you started on the Criminon program,
 and in particular your wins from The Way to Happiness
 Course. Do they want changes in their life too?
- Give him/her one of the enclosed yellow course request cards. They can also write a letter requesting the course. A new student must be the one requesting to start The Way to Happiness Course. You cannot fill out a card and request it for him or her. Remember, only give out yellow cards to NEW students, NOT to those already on the program.
- Follow up with this person to make sure they received The Way to Happiness book and course materials. Make sure they are doing the lessons and sending them in. Completing the course is what we are going for, so they can apply the material to change their lives. Some may need extra help understanding the material. Many need reminders of how valuable the course is, and how important it is to keep sending their lessons in.

- Once we receive a request card or letter with your name on the referred-by line, you get 1 point for a sign-up. The office then sends materials out to your student. When their first lessons come into the office, you get another 10 points and when they complete the course, you get 89 additional points for a total of 100 for each student who completes.
- All your referred students and earned points are tracked and reported each quarter. There is no carry over from one quarter to another. Everyone starts the game with zero points at the start of a quarter.
- When 3 or more students you refer send in their first lesson, you will receive a commendation from Alison at the end of the quarter.
- When you need more yellow cards, just write to Alison and ask for more. They are easy to hand out to others who fill them out and just drop them in the mail. Be sure to put your name on the bottom line (referred by). If you can't use the cards, ask your librarian or chaplain if you can put them out for others to pick up, or if you can post them on a bulletin board. YELLOW CARDS ARE FOR SIGNING UP NEW STUDENTS ONLY.
